

This week is Holy Week. We will look at the text from Palm Sunday and Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem. Noting the parallels Luke's account has with other scripture each day, keep in mind our theological questions:

- What does it say about God?
- What does it say about Human beings?
- What does it say about Creation?
- What does it say about the relationship between creation, God, and humanity (and how do the other passages connect to the theme passage from Luke 19 always the first listed each day)?

Monday April 10th - Read through the Palm Sunday passage from Luke 19:29-42.

Tuesday April 11th - Referencing Luke 19:36, read 2 Kings 9:13.
¹³ They quickly took their cloaks and spread them under him on the bare steps. Then they blew the trumpet and shouted, "Jehu is king!"

Wednesday April 12th - Referencing Luke 19:38, read Psalms 118:26.
²⁶ "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the LORD. From the house of the LORD we bless you."

Thursday April 13th - Referencing Luke 19:40, read Habakkuk 2:11.
¹¹ "Stones of the wall will cry out, and the beams of the woodwork will echo it."

Friday April 14th - Referencing Luke 19:41, read Isaiah 22:4.

Saturday April 15th - Read the contemporary selection from Palm Sunday's worship service. How does this apply to your relationship with Jesus Christ? As we remember this Saturday as the day Christ lay in the grave, there is a sense of loss that the One who is our Anam Cara (Soul Friend) is gone. Yet what if Christ could be with us, what if that One who knows us best would pierce the darkness and make the world a paradise again?
