# From the pastor's desk



"The poor you will always have with you" Matthew 26:11, Mark 14:7, John 12:8

"One great reason why the rich in general have so little sympathy for the poor is because they so seldom visit them. Hence it is that one part of the world does not know what the other suffers. Many of them do not know, because they do not care to know: they keep out of the way of knowing it – and then plead their voluntary ignorance as an excuse for their hardness of heart."

-John Wesley, Sermon 98 On Visiting the Sick

A great challenge we face today is that so many of us are allowing rumors to shape our world. We hear from people speaking on screens that seek to shape our opinion and world-view on different groups of people. Some we believe, others confirm what we already thought, and others we wonder if they are true but don't think much more about it.

While John Wesley's world didn't have the 24-hour news cycle (not existing to report news but to sell advertisement) he did realize that the rich in his day told each other who the poor really were. The rich educated one another about the lazy poor or the criminal poor. They confirmed the fears each held until they were accepted as true. While it may have been true of a few, it was by no means a fact for the entire population of poor in England. Wesley also knew that for the few that committed crimes that made the rich afraid, it was the circumstance of poverty that fueled the desperation.

Instead of chastising the rich, Wesley simply says to go and see for yourself. He is saying that you may identify as rich and make your decisions based on that, but if you identify as a Christian you have another, more important set of priorities.

Serving the poor is a definite command of Jesus. Even the scripture used above appears in three different Gospels, making sure that we understand it is a priority for God.

On the surface this scripture makes us think that it is inevitable for poverty to happen, just a fact of life. We can't do anything about it. The truth is that poverty is such a massive issue because it is an issue of health, education, happiness, life; it will take *everyone* united to alleviate it.

No matter your political affiliation, your faith affiliation unites you with others from different perspectives to serve the poor. We can set everything else aside because we know what Jesus is calling us to do.

May we all step out to meet new people to truly learn, face to face, what life is like for them. Get away from the screens and back into the world.

### **God's Bounty Food Drive**

God's Bounty is a not-for-profit food pantry that provides food to families in need in Franklin Township. The Franklin Township Ministerial Association saw a need in their community and in the fall of 2010, the area churches came together and began work. The parsonage of New Bethel Baptist Church was the site chosen for the food pantry. The doors opened on February 3, 2011.

The pantry services about 100 families each week. Churches supporting the pantry take a week each month to supply volunteers that sort, pack, and hand out food. Our week is the third Thursday. If you are interested in a tour or learning about volunteering, please see Charlie Walters.

**During the month of April, we will be collecting food for God's Bounty food pantry.** Just grab a red or green food pantry bag from the display and bring it back. **Any donations brought in by April 27**<sup>th</sup> **will be given to our scout troops for Scouting for Food**.

Our scout troops 104 and 219 are participating in *Scouting for Food in April* and will also be collecting for God's Bounty in local neighborhoods. If you find a bag hanging off your door from one of our troops asking for a donation, please help them out.
