Smoke Signals BY PASTOR MATTHEW STULTZ

The priest will then completely burn all of it on the altar as an entirely burned offering, a food gift of soothing smell to the Lord. (Lev. 1:8b-9)

As a BBQ cook, the notion of something "burnt" being pleasing isn't something I would celebrate. Without going crazy unpacking the ancient Hebrew here, the basic idea is that the smell of roasting meat is pleasing to God. It was pleasing because it was part of the faithful gift of the people to God.

To be honest, there isn't a great theological idea that we can pair with our upcoming BBQ Fellowship meal from the idea of meat used as part of a religious rite. So, here's what we can take: God loves the smell of a cookout and as Christians we have always done our best gathering around a table of food.

This next Fellowship Dinner, August 16th at 6:00pm, we will gather for some fired meat, hopefully not burnt. I will cook meat over a charcoal fire, and we will feast. There will be brisket and pulled pork as well as some ribs. Salads, fruit, and dessert would be appreciated to get those plates full!

I will be cooking in the parking lot outside the Fellowship Hall Tuesday evening. Feel free to drop by 7-10:00pm to visit, tour the trailer, or just say hello.

We will be celebrating the legacy of the Garage Sale at this dinner. It is appropriate to say "thank you" to God for providing emergency financial needs through this fund raiser when it first began. As things have changed over the past few years, the level of effort it takes for such a massive undertaking just isn't feasible. So, we want to acknowledge just how important the Garage Sale has been, share some memories, and celebrate at the dinner table. 
Our local food pantry, God's Bounty, serves Franklin Township and is supported by AUMC and several churches in the township.




