Bread, Bath, & Beyond

Join us as we find opportunities to move beyond our limitations and find new beginnings and be better than we were before. ***Our new 8-week series, Bread, Bath, & Beyond, started on August 4th.*** We will use this cultural word-play in our series title to remember that the most basic transforming experiences of our faith – communion and baptism – are the starting points for life “beyond” our limitations.

Christian Hospitality Is Not Entertaining

When our culture talks about having people over, they often use the language of entertainment: “I like entertaining,” or “Here are some tips on entertaining.” Christian hospitality, however, is not entertaining. It is not the addition of some religion to entertaining.

Hospitality has totally different motives, means, and ends, largely because it is not about us. Biblical hospitality is about honoring God by obeying His command to “contribute to the needs of the saints and seek to show hospitality” (Romans 12:13). It is about loving other Christians. When hospitality does become about the giver, it ceases to be Christian.

Unlike entertaining, hospitality does not seek to impress or network or create obligation. Instead, it seeks to serve. Because it is other-focused and requires sacrifice, biblical hospitality will be a tool that God uses to root out self-centeredness in us.

Christian hospitality honors the Lord. Practicing hospitality is part of being faithful. Our job is obedience, trusting the Lord to use it in the best way, even when we can’t see it. That is why practicing biblical hospitality is part of walking by faith, not by sight. And perhaps it is this aspect that makes it not only distinct in this world, but also very useful in Christ’s kingdom.

God's Bounty Update

God's Bounty food pantry, established by the Franklin Township Ministerial Association, is an important resource in our neighborhood for those struggling to pay for food. **Numbers in the last months have been increasing: 385 families were served in April, 408 families in May, and 389 families in June.**

Concern was expressed at the last God's Bounty board meeting about the falling cash donations and increasing food expenses. Some of the more expensive items and those not as nutritional are no longer purchased weekly to help focus the money on the nutritional and requested food.

Money donated to God's Bounty are used to purchase food from Gleaner's and Meijer. **Cash donations are appreciated and can be given on Sunday morning or on-line.** From our Amazing Mission Fund and designated giving, our congregation alone donated a total of \$4,500 in the Meijer Simply Give money in June and almost all of that has been used already!

If you wish to provide groceries, there are red bags available in the narthex. Just fill up a bag and missions will take it to the pantry. **Please limit donations to chunky soups, canned fruit and vegetables, peanut butter, cereal, and oatmeal.**

If you attend a United Methodist church, you are a member of the United Women of Faith.

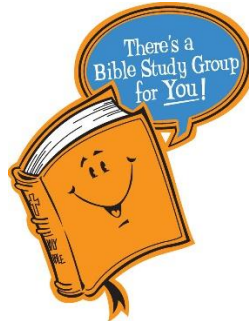
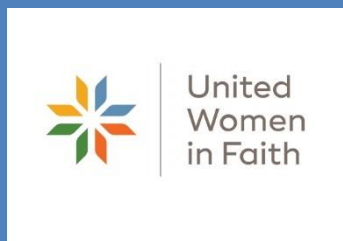
