# From the pastor's desk



## Love and Lent

*I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. John 13:34 (NRSV)*

This year we will begin our Lenten observance on February 14<sup>th</sup>. I received a message the other day with a picture of the ashes being placed on someone's forehead in the shape of a heart with the caption, "When Ash Wednesday is on Valentine's Day." That was a good one! It also got me thinking that with some of the darkness, some of the fasting, some of the reminder of what will drive Jesus to the Cross, we seldom think of Lent as love.

If you give something up for Lent, or you proactively add something to your life that draws you closer to God and your community, how is that not love? If we get to Maundy Thursday or Good Friday, or even Holy Saturday, how does the journey to the cross not scream love?

Each year I hear the phrase at least a handful of times, "Valentine's Day is just a day popularized by the greeting card companies." I'm sure that it is, and don't forget chocolate and flowers. The unfortunate thing about the tie this year between Lent and Valentine's Day is that many feel the same way about the church, and about Christianity in general. For them, Lent and Easter are just made-up holidays that are hollow and fleeting once the calendar page is turned. The Apostle Paul writes in 1 Corinthians that we are supposed to be all about the business of love:

*If I speak in the tongues of humans and of angels but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have prophetic powers and understand all mysteries and all knowledge and if I have all faith so as to remove mountains but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give away all my possessions and if I hand over my body so that I may boast but do not have love, I gain nothing. 1 Corinthians 13:1-3*

For many church people, the strict adherence to codes of conduct outweigh love. We strive to be in the right, not to be loving; to judge, not to be gracious.

Lent and Easter are all about love because our faith is all about love. If we are not loving, we've missed the point; no, we've missed the commandment given by Christ to love one another.

No matter how you observe Lent this year, be sure to share some of the love Christ has given you with someone else.

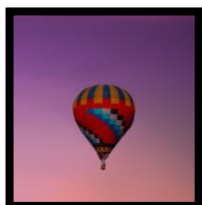

### LENTEN SERIES BEGINS ASH WEDNESDAY

#### GET UP TO SOMETHING INSTEAD OF GIVING SOMETHING UP THIS LENT



Lent is often known as a time of giving something up in order to make room in our lives for spiritual pursuits. Rather than just “giving up” in Lent, the scriptures ask us to consider all that Jesus is “up to” and all that he asks us to be up to in his name. Instead of bemoaning what we can’t do, or used to do, in a culture where “measuring up” to external standards seems impossible, this Lent we will celebrate the small things that we can do right now to respond to God's call in our place, for our time.

### INVITE SOMEONE INTO YOUR HOME

Below are excerpts from the article *How to Practice Biblical Hospitality* by Pat Ennis about showing hospitality to those by inviting others into your home. Read the whole article at the [gospelcoalition.org](http://gospelcoalition.org).

Whether enjoying personal devotions, a Bible study, or a worship service, what mental images emerge when you’re presented with passages that encourage hospitality? For many, the images mirror glossy magazine photos—an immaculate home, a gourmet menu, an exquisite table setting. And while some of these images could be applied to biblical hospitality in certain situations, what they actually portray is entertaining. **When hospitality is described in the Scriptures, there are zero instructions regarding home décor, menu, or table setting.** Romans 12:13b says we are to practice hospitality—literally, to “pursue the love of strangers” (Heb. 13:2)—not simply to hang out with our best friends.

The 21st-century church has cultivated highly sophisticated procedures and tools for evangelism. Training sessions, online and media resources, seminars, manuals, and methodology books are all available. However, **as we study Scripture, we also find that the home served as a center for evangelism in the early expansion of Christianity.**

Think about inviting someone over and don’t worry about the “entertaining” side of things. Just welcome them with love and hospitality.

They were able to provide 86 families with household items, blankets, food, and stocking stuffers, and 245 kids with clothing, games, sporting goods, stuffed animals, books, arts and crafts, and toiletries.

## Robert's Park UMC Community Meal

On Christmas Eve morning, nineteen people from our church family volunteered to prepare and help serve two meals to the downtown community, primarily homeless men. (See pictures on page 15.)

One meal was a sack lunch to take with them for later in the day. The second meal was a hot "sit down" dinner. Robert's Park UMC opens their dining room to the public every Sunday to serve a hot meal to the community. On Christmas Eve, they were served a ham dinner with all the side dishes and dessert. They were also supplied with new backpacks filled with numerous survival and hygiene necessities including our socks we collected.



We have already personally thanked each person, but we also want to use this forum to publicly thank each person who helped prepare, serve, and of course, clean up the two meals. We, indeed, have a generous church family who are willing to be the "hands and feet" of our Lord.
