"Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your hearts be troubled, neither let them be afraid." —John 14:27

The world is making many promises today. We are being told that swift changes to our national leadership structure is necessary and needed while some claim other nefarious motivations are at play. It is exhausting. It is scary. And most of all, it has become nearly impossible to find truthful and accurate reports on what is happening.

While it is true that government should be held accountable and audited for efficiency and trimmed of waste, there are many agencies that provide essential services for those who would otherwise be left to suffer. I think of the veterans that have served this country with honor, only to find themselves homeless and in need of help. While security and common good are necessary, de-humanizing those who need help is not the way of Jesus.

If you find that this administration at the federal or state level is misrepresenting your values as a Christian and as an American, you have a moral obligation to make your voice heard. To sit aside and say nothing is not the way our system is supposed to work.

Most of all, I want to remind you that no news service is unbiased, especially online. They shape their headlines to get you to click, which translates to numbers and higher rates for advertising. This causes our emotions to be stirred before our minds can ask, "Is this true?"

No matter what is going on, Christ is with us. And while we see things in our community and nation that are concerning, we have very little influence on their trajectory. What we can do is live our faith in our limited circles of influence and make sure our witness to Jesus Christ is based on his teachings, not interpretations that just don't match up with Christ. We do not have to live in fear with troubled hearts. Let's pray for our leaders and be busy in our community meeting as many needs as we can. Let us celebrate the humanity of each and every person and work to be ambassadors of peace.

Shepherd Community Center

Shepherd Community Center is a faith-based, nonprofit organization established in 1985 with a simple but staggering goal – *to break the cycle of poverty on the near Eastside of Indianapolis* through a holistic approach that meets the physical, emotional, spiritual and academic needs of neighbors from cradle to career – and beyond.

In 1985, Westside Church commissioned Dean Cowles and 12 congregation members to begin compassionate ministry in the old Central Church at 6125 East Washington Street, offering food and clothing. The name changed to Shepherd Community Center in 1988, and Shepherd moved to 4107 East Washington Street in 2006.

This March Acton will be collecting Styrofoam plates and bowls, plastic utensils, and trash bags for the center to use. Bring in what you can during March and leave your donation at the display. Missions will take our collection to Shepherd the first week of April.


