# From the pastor's desk



## Taking Care of Yourself BY PASTOR MATTHEW STULTZ

*Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. Romans 12:1-2*

I've been busy coordinating worship schedules and looking already to the Fall and praying for vision for the future of the congregation. As a pastor, it's my responsibility to continually listen for God and do my best to share the path we are supposed to take.

It has been so reassuring to see our worship attendance coming back, especially with new faces. We have had some amazing folks decide to make AUMC their church home. It is an amazing time!

As the momentum builds, we look to the future, we dream and vision and we begin putting the foundation in place for the church we want to be in 20 years, 10 years, 5 years and what needs to happen today to make that happen. While all of this is great the thing you can do right now to make a difference is take care of yourself. Paul says to the church in Rome that how you take care of yourself is a form of worship. How you rest, recharge for service is a testimony to Jesus and your love for him.

I find myself lacking on that front. I'm still part of the pastoral generation that was taught that if you aren't constantly exhausted and stressed out, you're not working hard enough. I've been eating better and losing weight but I'm coming to my annual reset of my vacation time. Because UM pastors move in June, my vacation time of 4 weeks is from June to June, and I have found that I still have half my vacation left. I went away with my wife to New Orleans, and I kept on my phone and did emails and wrote a sermon for the next Sunday. I'm beginning to realize that not only is it not healthy for me, but it is also a poor example for self-care for you. If your pastor can't stop and recharge, he or she is a poor leader.

So, I'm going to do better for myself, for my family, and for you.

How are you taking care of yourself today? Are you so busy that the things you are working towards cannot be enjoyed in their current form? How can you take tiny steps to be more present, more healthy, and less anxious?

Let's cheer one another on for a more abundant life in Christ Jesus.

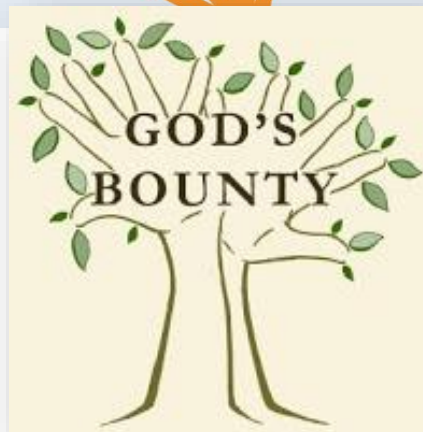

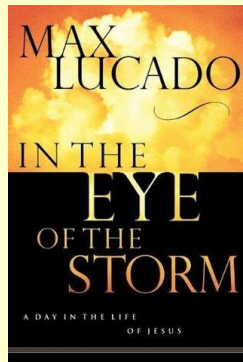

He watched 41 incarcerated men who had just spent 3½ days hearing about the love of Jesus Christ and the gospel message from the 38 Kairos volunteers complete the weekend experience. During open mic, many of them shared what a life changing experience it was. Larry will be spending May 5<sup>th</sup> with the men and will see most of them each Wednesday evening when they gather for prayer and share.
