# From the pastor's desk



Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and the sin that clings so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is set before us. Hebrews 12:1

November is a month of transitions. We transition from fall into winter. We transition from Halloween to Thanksgiving, and we transition into greater darkness as we approach the longest night of the year in December. November is a month of focus on harvest and stewardship, but I want to pause for a moment for us to think about a different kind of harvest: A harvest of joy.

Hebrews brings us the beautiful reminder that we are not alone in this journey and that in faith we are still connected to those we love, although we cannot see them anymore. I've done more funerals over the last month than normal, and I can say the mystery of grief still impacts me. To see the depth of pain and sorrow for the loss of someone is as human as you can get. And yet it is rare that I leave a celebration of life where something, some thread of joy remains, a gift from the departed preserved by Christ.

I know this season is difficult and it may be more so this year if you have experienced a loss recently or this is the first holiday season without a loved one. It's okay to be sad and it is okay to have days of struggle. But you don't have to do so alone. You have a pastor and a church, and we are here for you. So, look in on one another so that we might, as Paul said elsewhere, "bear one another's burdens."

The race we run isn't about finishing first, having the strongest faith or measurable success. The race that is set before us is a test of our endurance, not our speed and the great thing is that we are allowed to help one another, not just cheer from the sidelines. We aren't "in it to win it" because it's already been won. We just need to see each other to the finish line, harvesting joy along the way to keep one another going.

# **2024 Advent Mission Collection**

AUMC choses a special mission emphasis to which we direct extra dollars during the Advent Season, culminating with the Christmas Eve offering. Last Christmas, our collection was for RIP Medical Debt Relief. It was a resounding success with nearly \$15,000 raised to cancel about \$1.5 million in medical debt for struggling families in Marion County.

**This Advent, we will be focusing on ECHO** – A worldwide classroom based in Naples, Florida. ECHO has been teaching small-scale, sustainable farming methods to families for four decades. ECHO has been equipping and empowering hungry families with knowledge and the life-giving grace of God. They have impacted millions of lives by teaching families to provide for themselves and their communities. By tackling hunger at the source, hope grows from the ground. Agriculture experts and environmental leaders go out into the world to provide training and resources that empower small-scale farming families to thrive. Learn more at www.echonet.org.
