From the pastor's desk



Christ is Everything BY PASTOR MATTHEW STULTZ

Therefore, do not let anyone condemn you in matters of food or drink or of observing festivals, new moons, or Sabbaths. These are only a shadow of what is to come, but the body belongs to Christ. (Col. 2:16-17)

We are now in the month of October. Our series "Bumper Sticker Theology" is off and running, Fall Break is around the corner, and so is Halloween.

Halloween is a great time of the Fall season. While some want to paint it as a holiday of the devil, which it isn't (when looking to the ancient Irish Celts, we find it was a way to cope with the death of loved ones and the mystery of death as well as harvest celebrations and getting ready for winter) we prefer to embrace the season and polish it up as a family-friendly event.

We have had a great time each Fall for Trunk-or-Treat, providing a safe place for parents and kids to come and enjoy some candy and fellowship. We utilize the event that is already happening in our community and coming alongside to offer not an alternative, but an extra. We are offering a community of care and a purpose higher than ourselves. We are offering a place where people can be reminded of their value and worth, sharing the love of Jesus.

That's what Paul is trying to convey in Colossians: **Christ is Everything**. Whether we are opening the doors to a Pinewood Derby, a Christmas Eve or Easter service, or a Halloween party, Jesus is at the center of what we do. We don't care where Halloween may have originally come from (After all, December 25th isn't the birthday of Jesus but a pagan celebration of the birthday of the god Saturn), but it is how we claim it. If you still think Halloween is the "devil's holiday" think of it this way: We just stole, it from him and gave it to Jesus.

Most of all, Paul reminds us that as Christians, for our own community as well as how we project our beliefs into the community: put away anger, malice, and foul talk and to show kindness, meekness, patience, forgiveness, and love in imitation of Christ (Colossians 3:8, 12).

I am really looking forward to a great Trunk-or-Treat event for us all to gather and enjoy the time as well to greet and meet new families in our community.




